RULES:

1. Read 4-H General Rules
2. Read 4-H Livestock, Equine & Small Animal Rules
3. Barn closes at 10:00pm each night and reopens at 5:00am
4. Goats will be day stalled in Barn 1. Pens must be cleaned of any/all shavings & manure before departure or \$50 fee.
5. Collar required, any material, can use hand leads but no leashes, chain collar preferred.
6. DO NOT milk out on morning of show.
7. All dairy goats must be dehorned.
8. Dairy goats ID'd using tattoo and no scrapies tag must present registration papers correlating with tattoo at check-in
9. Exhibitors may use meshed or plastic muzzles on lambs and goats at the Adams County Fair. The style used must allow the animal to drink water.
10. Dairy and market goats must be clipped to show standards before entering the ring.
11. Male market animals must be wethered by spring tag-in.

GOAT Project members who intend to exhibit their animals at the Adams County Fair must complete the following to remain eligible for fair entry and exhibition:

1. Enroll in the Goat Project by enrollment deadline.
2. Attend Meat Quality Assurance Training (MQA) annually.
3. Complete and file an Animal Care and Housing Form (Primary Care) on 4HOnline (leased animals and animals not housed at home must turn form into Extension Office)
4. Tag all market goats at mandatory County Tag-in day.
5. ID all animals in 4HOnline by June 1 deadline.
6. Attend Record Book Interviews and present an up-to-date E-Record Book.
7. Enter fair classes online by entry deadline.
8. Complete and turn in E-Record Book the Friday before Labor Day to the Extension Office. *If a record book is not completed for each species exhibited, the member will forfeit premiums/awards and be ineligible to exhibit that species at the next year's Fair.*

4-H GOAT SHOWMANSHIP - NON-BRACING

Thursday August 3rd (following Breeding)



DIVISION: SHOWMANSHIP - NON-BRACING

- Junior Non-Bracing Goat Showmanship – 8-10 years
- Intermediate Non-Bracing Goat Showmanship – 11-13 years
- Senior Non-Bracing Goat Showmanship – 14 years and over



Goat members may only enter and compete in one showmanship class. Members will not be allowed to switch goat showmanship class type after Fair check in.

Non-bracing showmanship is open to any goat type that the exhibitor deems is best exhibited in a non-bracing showmanship style. (ex. dairy, utility, pygmy, fiber, breeding). This class will be judged based on a non-bracing showmanship style.

Showmanship will be considered non-bracing when animals are not braced when not in motion with the exception of perhaps when the judge handles the animal.

All animals entered in Showmanship must be eligible for at least 1 additional class at ADCO Fair.

Bracing showmanship is open to any goat type that the exhibitor deems is best exhibited in a bracing showmanship style. (ex. market, breeding wether does). This class will be judged based on a bracing showmanship style.

Showmanship will be considered bracing when animals are always braced when not in motion.

All animals entered in Showmanship must be eligible for at least 1 additional class at ADCO Fair.

This card must be submitted online no later than 2:00PM the day before the sale, (Friday). Late submissions will not be accepted.

Market goat minimum weight is 50lbs, and maximum weight is 125lbs

Male market animals must be wethered by spring tag-in.
