- **Stalls must be cleaned of any/all shavings & manure before departure or \$50 fee.**

RULES:



1. Read 4-H General Rules
2. Read 4-H Livestock, Equine & Small Animal Rules
3. Swine will be stalled in Barn 4. Pens must be cleaned of any/all shavings & manure before departure or \$50 fee.
4. Bedding: Straw will not be allowed; only wood chips/shavings.
5. Feeders/Waterers: All feed and water containers which remain in the pen must be secured to the stall.
6. Care/Fitting/Grooming: Once hogs have arrived at the fairgrounds, only hairdressing compounds in their original container and labeled for use on swine may be used. During all swine shows, hogs may only be shown with water; hairdressing compounds of any kind will not be permitted. Violation will result in automatic disqualification.
7. Clipping is permitted at the Fair if completed with undue stress to the animal. No snaring or restraining will be tolerated. Determination of undue stress will be made by the Superintendents.
8. All market swine must have been identified with an Adams County ear tag and universal ear notches in both ears per the Spring Tag-In procedures. Breeding swine will be identified with ear notches.
9. Hogs are to be washed and clean with ear tags and ear notches legible at time of weigh-in or they will be rejected. Mud packed hogs will not be allowed to weigh-in. Animals with fresh ear notches (determined by Superintendent and Extension Office) will not be allowed to compete.
10. Market swine cannot be shown in breeding classes. An animal is considered market when it crosses the scale at official Fair weigh-in.

Record Book: Livestock E-Record and any necessary supplements required. Due the Friday before Labor Day



Open Class: Open Mini's (Age 5-7) Swine Class - See Department Open Minis - Tuesday, August 1st, following showmanship



Swine Project members who intend to exhibit their animals at the Adams County Fair must complete the following to remain eligible for fair entry and exhibition:

1. Enroll in the Swine Project by enrollment deadline.
2. Attend Meat Quality Assurance Training (MQA) annually.
3. Complete and file an Animal Care and Housing Form (Primary Care) on 4HOnline (leased animals and animals not housed at home must turn form into Extension Office)
4. Properly tag all market swine by tagging deadline.
5. ID all swine in 4HOnline by applicable deadline.
6. Attend Livestock Record Book Interviews and present an up-to-date E-Record Book.
7. Enter fair classes online by entry deadline.
8. Complete and turn in E-Record Book the Friday before Labor Day to the Extension Office. *If a record book is not completed for each species exhibited, the member will forfeit premiums/awards and be ineligible to exhibit that species at the next year's Fair.*

- January Gilt: farrowed in January 2023
- February Gilt: farrowed in February 2023
- Spring Gilt: farrowed Mar. 1, 2023- June 1, 2023



Only breeding females (gilts/sows) will be allowed to show. Boars are not allowed at Fair.

Breeding females cannot be shown as market also. An animal is considered market once it crosses the scale at weigh-in.

Breeding females will be identified by ear notches.

Each exhibitor will be given a sale declaration card with instructions to declare online. This declaration designates which animal they would like to send to the Jr. Livestock Sale. This declaration must be submitted to the Extension office no later than 2:00PM the day before the Sale (Friday). Late submissions will not be accepted.
