- 1. E Record Books: Update their "Equipment/Supplies Inventory" (p. 3) & "Animal Inventory" and/or "Animal Purchase" pages (p. 4&6) **We are switching to the Livestock Record books (or LAA) this year so make sure members are aware they will need to type in llama/alpaca on the front page where they mark species.
- 2. **Hands On:** Practice their showmanship skills leading, setting, quadrants, backing.
- 3. **Knowledge:** Members should review types of shearing cuts and decide which they will use on their animal (pg 72 resource handbook or video)



APPLY: Why is it important to know where to find answers?


INTERMEDIATE: Accompany the veterinarian for a day and see how he/she diagnoses
