


# Project Progress

# Judges Score Sheet **Showmanship**

NOTE: Judges use this form as a guide for scoring the handler's performance. **Deduct points in each section; total these points and subtract from 100 possible points giving the handler a total score for their performance.** 

EXHIBITOR #:	SCORE DEDUCTIONS	COMMENTS
PREPARATION - 25 POINTS:		
<u>Handler:</u> Clean, neatly attired. No open-toed or heeled shoes, saggy pants, billowy skirts, not flashy. Positive attitude, good sportsmanship, attentive to judge and alpaca at all times		
Alpaca: Clean, blanket not brushed or blown out, legs, face, hindquarters clean. If shorn, entire body clean. Toenails trimmed.		
<u>Halter/Lead:</u> Safe, well fitting properly positioned on alpaca.		
PERFORMANCE - 75 POINTS:		
Follows the prescribed pattern and instructions. Performs work accurately, smoothly, timely.		
Alpaca leads, stops, turns, backs up, sets up willingly with minimum visible/audible cueing.		
Handler leads on left side holding lead correctly. Correct use of lead shank.		
Maintains safe and correct positions – being aware of judge at all times. Eye contact.		
Question concerning their alpaca, alpacas in general, anatomy of alpaca.








### Llama

- wild or domestic? \_
- height 40-45" at the withers
- special qualities: quick learner; able to be used as a beast of burden; has banana shaped ears

### Vicuna

- wild or domestic? \_\_
- height 28-36" at the withers
- special qualities: highly valuable fleece that is protected by law.



# Guanaco

- wild or domestic?
- height 42-48" at the withers
- special qualities: wool reddish-brown above and white below.

# \_\_\_\_\_ Alpaca

- wild or domestic?
- height 30-39" at the withers
  - special qualities: valuable fleece; strait, rounded ears.
