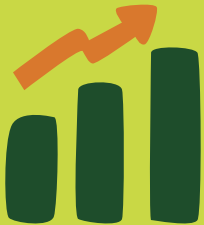
## Upcoming Deadlines

Suggest the following as things your members should work on or accomplish with their project this month:



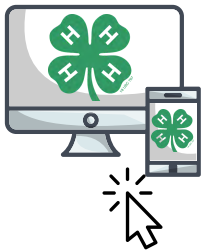
- E Record Books:** Complete their "General Dog Care" (p. 4) & "Feeding Record" pages (p. 6)
