- 1. **E Record Books:** Update their "Equipment/Supplies Inventory" (p. 3) & "Animal Inventory" pages (p. 4)
- 2. **Hands On:** Members should practice trimming their rabbits claws so they do not scratch when being handled.
- 3. **Knowledge:** Members should learn what type of feed they should feed and in what quantities based on their rabbit's needs (Rabbit Resource Handbook pg. 50).
- 4. **Other:** Brainstorm a topic for their Rabbit educational poster and/or demonstration.

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#### **4-H Rabbit Group Activity**

#### Visit a Pet Store – Need vs. Want

#### **Overview:**

Take your club members to a pet store to see what rabbit products are being sold, and discuss as a group which products they think are a project NEED vs. a project WANT. Discuss how the products might benefit their animal's health, behavior, care or training.

#### **Supplies:**

- 1. Print the attached activity table for each member.
- 2. Pencils
- 3. Clipboards (optional)

**Do:** Visit the rabbit section of the pet store and list all the rabbit products begin sold and what the products are used for.

**<u>Reflect:</u>** Discuss whether the products are a need or a want.

**Apply:** Members should determine if they need to purchase any of the "NEED" items for their project rabbits.




