
Suggest the following as things your members should work on or accomplish with their project this month.



Did YOU KNOW.... Putting flavored gelatin mix or instant drink mix in your water at home a few days before the show, and then using it at the show to mask the taste of different water may encourage your animals to drink normal amounts of water. Factis Healthy Pigs

Clean, fresh water and nutritious food are essential for the pig. The goal is to have good nutrition and care each day in order for the animal to have optimal condition at show time. It is not humane to allow your animal to be too thin or too fat and try to correct it days before the show. Feed additives alter the metabolism of the animal and may affect the way the animal handles stress. Stress can result from weight management, showing and loading. Animals should be checked daily for signs of injury or illness. Always treat the animal immediately for any problems. If indoubt always seek advice from a veterinarian.

When visiting someone else's swine facility respect their rules. Biosecurity precautions include:

- wash hands with soap and water before and after visit.
- park vehicles on paved surfaces
- avoid unnecessary contact with animals and facilities.
- wear clean rubber boots; clean and disinfect them.
- clean and disinfect all equipment
- wear clean overalls; disinfect after visit

More challenges

1. Do the Sunscreen experiment.

The purpose of this activity is to show how sunscreen and other topical medications can be absorbed through the skin of livestock.

Materials needed:

- · red and blue food coloring
- 2 glasses or clear plastic
- several celery sticks with leaves
- knife

Steps:

cups

- · Cut the bottom of each celery stick
- Place several drops of red coloring in one glass and several drops of blue coloring in the other glass. Put several celery stalks in each glass.
- Wait two hours and observe what happens.
- Split the celery stalks to observe the water transport system. Also observe the leaves. Explain to the project members that sunscreens and any other medications applied to the skin of livestock can be absorbed by the body. They must be used with care and only according to label instructions.




