# About the Project

Rabbit hopping is a fun way for you to work with your rabbit and bond. It provides exercise and mental stimulation for both caged and house rabbits. Rabbit jumping began in Sweden early in the 1970s when the first rabbit club started to arrange rabbit jumping competitions. At that time, the rules were based on the rules from horse jumping, but were later reformed to be better suited for rabbits.

## Project Requirements

Rabbit project members who intend to exhibit their animal(s) at the Adams County Fair must complete the following to remain eligible for fair entry and exhibition:

- 1. Enroll in the Rabbit Project by the enrollment deadline.
- 2. Complete the Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) training annually.
- 3. Complete and file an Animal Care and Housing Form on 4HOnline by deadline.
- ID all rabbits in 4HOnline by May 1 deadline (must own project animals at least 90 days prior to Fair)
- 5. Attend Animal Record Book Interviews and present an up-to-date E-Record Book.
- 6. Enter Fair classes online by deadline.
- Complete and turn in the Livestock E-Record with supplement Rabbit Hopping pages by Friday before Labor Day to the Extension Office.
- 8. All Rabbit Hopping project members and their rabbits must attend a minimum of three (3) hopping training program practices prior to Fair entry deadline.
- 9. Rabbit Hopping project rabbits must be a minimum of four (4) months old to begin training.

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# Additional Information - Animal Entry in 4hOnline

- 1. 4-H members are required to enter their animals in the 4hOnline enrollment system. This page will help summarize the information required in this system.
- 2. All rabbit project animals must be entered in the 4hOnline system no later than May 1 of the current project year (meat pen does in by April 1).
- 3. Rabbit members will enter their rabbits in either Breeding or Market. See images below. All 'bold' items are required. Images are optional.
- 4. It is highly recommended that any and all animals with the potential of attending Fair have ID in 4hOnline. If an animal does not have ID, it will not be allowed at Fair

- 5. Review Fair premium book to understand show rules and classes
- 6. Attend required and optional club and county workshops to learn
- 7. Work on Livestock E-Recordbooks regularly.
