Project Requirements

Rabbit Project members who intend to exhibit their animal(s) at the Adams County Fair must complete the following:

- Enroll in the Rabbit Project in 4-HOnline
- Complete and submit an <u>Animal Care and Housing Form</u> to the 4-H office by May 1
- (**Meat doe ID due April 1)
 - Required in 4-H Online:
 - Tattoo number (if your rabbit is not tattooed yet, enter "000")
 - Breed
 - Sex
 - Animal Name
 - Animal birthdate
 - Optional in 4-H Online:
 - Photo
 - Tag number
 - Color + markings
 - Sire/dam info
 - Weight
 - For a how-to guide to animal ID in 4-H Online, click Rabbit on the <u>state 4-H</u>
 <u>Online page</u>, tab: Family Resources
- Attend the Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) training once per year and pass the MQA test
- Keep record of your rabbit project in the Livestock Record Book available for download on the Colorado 4-H website
- Market Rabbits ONLY: get your rabbits tattooed either at our county clinic or elsewhere
- Present an up-to-date Livestock Record Book (also called e-record) with a green record book cover (buy here) at Record Book Interviews
- Enter fair classes on the Fair Entry website by July 1
- Complete and turn in the Livestock Record Book with a green cover and any necessary supplements for breeding rabbits by Friday before Labor Day to the Extension Office.

- Read the General Rules, Livestock, Equine & Small Animal Rules, and 4-H Rabbits sections of the <u>Fair Premium Book</u>
- Attend the Rabbit/Cavy Tattoo Clinic in June (market rabbits are required to attend)
- Join the Rabbit Judging Team
